Notes:

- ROHS is an EU requirement that is intended to eliminate or restrict the use of certain environmentally harmful substances. Jergens manufactured items meet these requirements. Some purchased items may need to be verified before certification. See the marked catalog in Customer Service.
- **DFARS** is a USA government requirement that certain "specialty metals" be melted in the US or one of the "approved" countries. The "specialty metals" in Jergens products are mainly the alloy steel (4140) used in hoist rings and stainless steels used in KLP's and some spring plungers. If the product does not contain these metals it is exempt from the DFARS requirements. Fasteners are exempt.
